Tom Eggert is the founder and Executive Director of the WI Sustainable Business Council (<http://www.bus.wisc.edu/sustainability/council/>), and coordinates the annual WI Sustainable Business Council Conference.. He also is the co-director of the Business, Environment & Social Responsibility Program (a graduate certificate program) at the WI School of Business. He serves as an adjunct faculty member, teaching classes in Environmental Strategy and Sustainability, Systems Thinking and Sustainable Businesses, Business and the Social Side of Sustainability, and he coordinates the CleanTech Thought Leaders Series, a community forum offered on Fridays throughout the school year. In addition to his work with the School of Business, he directs the environmental leadership program for the WI Department of Natural Resources in the Eastern portion of the State of Wisconsin. He has a BS from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and an MPA from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Before obtaining his law degree at George Washington University, he was a Peace Corps volunteer in the Philippines. Before returning to Wisconsin, he worked in environmental law with the Attorney General's Office in Montana.
